

Rules of the Road (for bicycles)

Right of Way – Cyclists must yield to pedestrians and slower moving traffic except when passing. Pedestrians always have the right of way. Slow down when the trail is crowded.

Keep to the Right – All trail users should keep to the right except when passing or turning left. Move off the trail to the right when stopping. Pedestrians should walk no more than 2 abreast and readily walk single file when the trail is busy.

Ride appropriately – ride according to conditions. Use extra caution when trails are busy or riding on steep grades.

Limit speed to your sight and stopping distance – Ride at an appropriate speed for the conditions you encounter on the trail. Slow down for intersecting trails, hills, and turns.

Control Pets – Keep pets leashed while on the trail and clean up after your pet. Keep leashes short and walk pets on the outside of the trail. Don't try to manage a leash from your bike.

Advise others when passing – Sound a bell or horn, or call out when approaching pedestrians or slower-moving cyclists, then pass on the left. Pedestrians should acknowledge with a wave, then step to the right.

Earphone Dangers – If you use earphones on trails, keep the volume low enough to hear people and traffic around you.
